DREXEL HILL, Pa.—June 30, 2009—Angels on the Atlantic, a non-profit organization that provides a recreational, beachside experience to underserved, inner-city youth, today announced that it will not be operating for the Summer of 2009 in Ocean City, N.J. as it has done for the past three seasons. The organization will continue to fulfill its mission with a transition program in support of local youth groups throughout the summer.

“We want to thank all of our partners, donors and volunteers for their continued support over the last three years,” said Jeanie Hubach, Co-Founder and CEO, Angels on the Atlantic. “Their steadfast commitment to Angels on the Atlantic and the dozens of emails and calls of support we’ve received in the past few days have inspired us to transition the program in a way that will still enable us to make a difference in the lives of local children in need. Despite the situation with Ocean City, we will persevere and fulfill our mission.”

Recent legal issues within Ocean City have prevented the organization from continuing the program at its 9 Beach Rd. location for the current season. Beginning in July, Angels on the Atlantic will sponsor recreational and educational day trips for several youth-based community groups, including Caring People Alliance.

“Our program is committed to a long-term partnership with Angels on the Atlantic and we look forward to working with them during this transition period and beyond,” said William Butler, Center Director, West Philadelphia Community Center of Caring People Alliance. “This summer, Angels on the Atlantic will sponsor our center and enable us to deliver a fun-filled day at the shore for the children in our program.”
